## THE DECORATIVE ARTS TRUST AWARDS 2026 IDEAL INTERNSHIP GRANTS TO FIVE INSTITUTIONS

Media, PA — The Decorative Arts Trust is pleased to announce the six institutions that received IDEAL Internship Grants for 2026: the Chester County History Center in West Chester, PA; the Chrysler Museum of Art in Norfolk, VA; the Dennos Museum Center in Traverse City, MI; the Gibbes Museum of Art in Charleston, SC; and the Yakima Valley Museum in Yakima, WA.

The Chester County History Center intern will assist with researching and installing a temporary exhibition to celebrate the Semiquincentennial.

The Chrysler Museum of Art internship will focus on research, planning, and engagement for the 2028 exhibition *The Triumph of Nature: Art Nouveau from the Chrysler Museum of Art*.

The intern at the Dennos Museum Center at Northwestern Michigan College will research the museum's Works Project Administration-era collection in preparation for a fall 2026 exhibition.

The Gibbes Museum of Art's intern will gain knowledge of the varied roles that contribute to the institution's success and will complete a capstone project focused on the collection and engagement, such as a research project, exhibition, or public program.
