The 2026 Winter Olympics in Milano-Cortina will bring the world to Italy for a visually stunning and highly competitive Games spread across Milan, Cortina d'Ampezzo, and surrounding mountain venues. With more than 100 medal events across skiing, snowboarding, skating, hockey, and sliding sports, the Games promise elite

competition, iconic alpine backdrops, and massive global attention as traditional powers like the United States, Norway, Germany, and Canada battle for winter supremacy.

For Team USA, the spotlight will shine on some of the country's most recognizable and marketable stars. Lindsey Vonn's return to the Olympic stage would be one of the Games' biggest storylines, while Chloe Kim looks to further cement her legacy as one of snowboarding's all-time greats. American medal hopes also rest with alpine icon Mikaela Shiffrin, figure-skating phenom Ilia Malinin, speed-skating star Jordan Stolz, and Olympic champion Erin Jackson, alongside strong U.S. programs in freestyle skiing, snowboarding, and hockey. With a blend of superstar power, experience, and rising talent, Team USA enters Milano-Cortina positioned for a memorable and medal-filled Winter Games.

This is going to be another fantastic Winter Games that you will not want to miss; make sure to tune in and catch all the action.

Saturday 7 February sees Day 1 of official competition at the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026 in Italy, with the first outing for freestyle skiing medal hopeful, Kirsty Muir.

The X-Games winner at Aspen 2026 takes to the Livigno Snow Park to compete in the two-run women's slopestyle qualification with an eye on Monday's final. The 21-year-old is competing at her second Winter Olympics having been the youngest Briton at the Beijing 2022 edition, aged just 17.

The mixed curling round robin sessions continue today, having started ahead of Friday's official Opening Ceremony of XXV Olympiad. Scotland's Bruce Mouat and Jennifer Dodds face a North American double header on Saturday as they take on Canada in the morning, then Team USA later in the day.

"You'll never say no to 4-0 at the Olympics. We've kind of been building and today was the first one where we've been really solid," Jen Dodds told Olympics.com after the duo won their fourth match of the tournament on Friday, before confirming they had managed to get a photo with Snoop Dogg, who has been roaming the venues in Italy.

More than 2,900 athletes from 92 national Olympic committees will compete at the Milano-Cortina Winter Olympic Games. The United States will have the largest presence with more than 230 athletes, followed by Canada with 210 athletes and host nation Italy with 196.

The opening ceremony marks the official start of the 2026 Winter Olympics and takes place at Milan's San Siro Stadium, with additional events around Milan and athlete parades in Predazzo, Livigno and Cortina d'Ampezzo, starting at 2 p.m. ET.

The Parade of Nations, with participating athletes from around the globe, and the traditional lighting of the Olympic flame are some of the highlights of the opening ceremony.

The pageantry will include performances from Mariah Carey, Laura Pausini, Andrea Bocelli and Sabrina Impacciatore of the HBO show, "White Lotus."
